IPP Economic Well-Being Survey</b>	<p>IPP CAPC Purpose: The purpose of this survey is to identify and determine factors across communities that will facilitate planning and prevention efforts to mitigate economic hardship as a risk factor for child maltreatment and build protective factors.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Updated “Purpose” for community</li> <li>Clarified that all questions were optional to answer</li> <li>Added definitions for “Household” and “Head of Household”</li> <li>Removed headers but open to re-adding them</li> <li>Need to add Child Care throughout the survey (Q1, Q4 and Q21)</li> <li>Add WIC (spelled out)</li> <li>Remove General Assistance (will be captured in Cash Benefits)</li> <li>COVID as a challenge will be captured in Health, Other and in COVID specific questions.</li> <li>Add “job options” as a challenge (Lack of job opportunities)</li> <li>Break up “Health” into “Physical Health”, “Use of tobacco, cannabis, alcohol, and/or drugs”, and “Mental Health (Ex. Anxiety, depression, stress level)”</li> <li>Add vaccination status as a barrier to employment</li> <li>Add internet and computer access to barriers for school readiness</li> </ul>	<p>Will need to discuss plans for how the survey will go out.</p>	



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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Run whole survey through language accessibility software</li> <li>• Combine/condense questions wherever possible.</li> <li>• Compare to Protect Factors Survey (PFS2): Comparing language and grouping</li> <li>• Remove questions specifically asking about “affordable housing” - We all agree affordable housing is an issue that is prevalent across the all the Sierra-Sacramento Counties</li> </ul>		
<b>VII. CDRT Best Practices</b>	<p>Updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Changes coming</li> <li>• Plan being revised and will be sent out once complete</li> <li>• Will get the state list of contacts out to everyone</li> <li>• Advocacy Letter in process</li> </ul> <p>Citizen Review Panel, Critical Incident Review Panel:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Done three reports with recommendations for the state to revive the CA State Child Death Review</li> <li>• This year – focus on making County CDRTS stronger</li> <li>• Survey has gone out, but three counties that have not completed it. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Nevada</li> <li>○ Amador</li> <li>○ El Dorado</li> </ul> </li> <li>• 30 Counties have responded so far</li> <li>• Once Counties are supported and Best Practices are in place, then the Citizen Review Panel will advocate for State CDRT again.</li> </ul> <p>CDRT Participation: Do other CAPCs have trouble being included on CDRTs?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Amador not invited</li> <li>• El Dorado “invited themselves” on</li> <li>• Nevada not invited but going to try and “self-invite”</li> </ul>	Stephanie will email the CDRT Survey to the IPP CAPC Representatives to help get them completed.

Recap/Knowledge Sharing	<p>Recap provided Knowledge Sharing and Celebrations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Tracy (Amador): Resilient Amador had 16 people attend their meeting yesterday (which is an increase from about 5 people attending regularly). Coalition agreed that CAPC needed to address homelessness and the trauma associated in an article, which Tracy took on and recently completed the Draft.</li> <li>• Melody (Nevada): Survey being released to the community to gauge their impressions of prevention planning in Nevada County. Expecting “I don’t know” answers but think that will be helpful to know where to target outreach. Also took OCAP Pre-Prevention survey for baseline.</li> <li>• Robin (Calaveras): Continuing to do prevention Planning. Best thing is partnership with CWS improving and new partnerships across the board. Barb (Strategies TA) has been helpful, particularly with equity lens and help with ARPA funds. Also, working with CWS on new Differential Response for children 0-5.</li> <li>• Amy (Alpine): Successful pop-up play groups in the community. All schools are back in session. Want to begin to prioritize Prevention Planning.</li> <li>• Courteny (Mono): Prevention Plan brought up at CAPC to review. CAPC hesitant to participate so now bringing it to the AB 2083 group to begin working with Social Services. Looking forward to next CAP Month!</li> </ul>
