Barriers:

Membership & Composition:

- First 5 – CAPC gets lost in focus (only serve 0-5)
- Staffing – Can't do as much outreach or as many events
- COE – Required standards to meet, need higher amount of funds to function, need more staffing
- Revisit the CTF minimum allocation in order to have viable prevention efforts
- Need minimum funds for 1 full staff, viable and sustainable funds,
- Limited advocacy in CWS

Collaboration:

- CAPC suffers when there is a lack of school engagement
- Need schools to value MCART and to have the required reporting steps enforced.
- CAPC's need to be re-incorporated into CDRT
- Re-incorporate prevention into CDRT

CAPC Function:

- Need CAPC's in WIC required for CDRT participation



- Lack of funding to participate in more functions
- Can improve the quality of functions with funding

Activities/Functions:

- Rebranding where “Prevention” is the recognized instead of the “Child Abuse” aspect. (Example: Caller ID says “Child Abuse...” or being called the “Child Abuse Council”.
- Missing “Neglect” aspect of abuse
- Staffing

Funding:

- The time it takes to seek out funds
- Time consuming to write public and private grants (CDBG, Sierra Health Foundation)
- Small rural communities don’t have the data to stress the needs of their impoverished families.
- Data accuracy
- Staffing for research, data collection, and grant writing.

Involvement in County Planning:

- Nothing clearly defined as to requirements and options
- Staffing power to attend all the different meetings
- Not necessarily invited as CAPC Representatives. (Invited as FRC leads, or ED’s of agencies)
- Funding needs to allow presence at multiple agencies
- Communication gets diluted when you wear several hats at the table
- CAPC’s need to be identified by other agencies, regularly. (Email list serves, etc.)
