- COE Required standards to meet, need higher amount of funds to function, need more staffing
- Revisit the CTF minimum allocation in order to have viable prevention efforts
- Need minimum funds for 1 full staff, viable and sustainable funds,
- Limited advocacy in CWS

Collaboration:

- CAPC suffers when there is a lack of school engagement
- Need schools to value MCART and to have the required reporting steps enforced.
- CAPC's need to be re-incorporated into CDRT
