Poverty Assessment	 Key points Important to define poverty Change "poverty" to a different, less stigmatic term Identify gaps in the system Acknowledge people on the cusp who don't quality for low-income benefits but are still financially struggling Keep rural counties in mind (hard to get data/difficult to identify problems due to small size) Needs to be flexible Who should be surveyed? Who will have the best information that helps us understand at the community level what poverty looks like? Traditional partners: agency- and organization-driven Send out to the community to reach more than the normal respondents Use FRCs, schools, and other community organizations to disperse to families (Preschools, daycares, and schools to connect with parents) Behavioral/mental health services Activity bags – fill out survey in exchange for bag Food banks Important for this to be an exchange, not a demand Engage local small businesses/Chambers of Commerce Definition of poverty Check county income guidelines 	 Create definitions of poverty Think about where we want to do the survey Generate list of partners who we can work with, get data from, and target for participation Look into data Identify other counties that have done a survey of this type
